Enjoy another great recipe using the vegetables we have grown in the church garden. This is a delicious Spanish soup, perfect for a summer heat wave ... serve chilled. No hot stove required.

# GAZPACHO SOUP

-two (2) pounds red tomatoes, cut into chunks
-one (1) green pepper (such as Anaheim or cubenelle)
cored, seeded, cut into chunks
-one (1) cucumber, cut into chunks
-one (1) onion (red or white), cut into chunks
-one (1) clove garlic
-two (2) teaspoons sherry vinegar
-salt
-olive oil

## STEP 1

-Combine tomatoes, pepper, cucumber, onion and garlic in a blender. Blend STED 2 at high speed until smooth, at least two minutes.

With the motor running, add the vinegar and two teaspoons salt. Slowly drizzle olive oil. If it seems watery, drizzle in more olive oil until texture is creamy.

## STEP 3

Strain the mixture through a strainer or a food mill. Discard Solids. Transfer to a large glass pitcher and chill until very cold, at least 6 hours or overnight.

## STEP 4


Before serving, adjust seasonings with salt and vinegar. If soup is very thick, stir in a few tablespoons ice water. A few drops of olive oil on top or fresh veggies is a nice touch.



The Epistle James focuses not on doctrine, but on action. The focus is how the Christian Faith is to be lived on a day-to-day basis. Although Jesus is seldom referred to or quoted in James, Jesus' teaching on the Sermon on the Mount underlies much of James. Traditionally it has been assumed that the James who wrote this epistle was the brother of Jesus and the leader of the church in Jerusalem. The date the letter was written is uncertain, but could be as early as 45 AD, possibly making it the earliest New Testament book we have.

**Common English Bible** 

#### Taming the tongue

My brothers and sisters, not many of you should become teachers, because we know that we teachers will be judged more strictly. **2** We all make mistakes often, but those who don't make mistakes with their words have reached full maturity. Like a bridled horse, they can control themselves entirely. **3** When we bridle horses and put bits in their mouths to lead them wherever we want, we can control their whole bodies.

**4** Consider ships: They are so large that strong winds are needed to drive them. But pilots direct their ships wherever they want with a little rudder. **5** In the same way, even though the tongue is a small part of the body, it boasts wildly.

Think about this: A small flame can set a whole forest on fire. **6** The tongue is a small flame of fire, a world of evil at work in us. It contaminates our entire lives. Because of it, the circle of life is set on fire. The tongue itself is set on fire by the flames of hell.

- **7** People can tame and already have tamed every kind of animal, bird, reptile, and fish.
- **8** No one can tame the tongue, though. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. **9** With it we both bless the Lord and Father and curse human beings made in God's likeness.
- **10** Blessing and cursing come from the same mouth. My brothers and sisters, it just shouldn't be this way!
- **11** Both fresh water and salt water don't come from the same spring, do they? **12** My brothers and sisters, can a fig tree produce olives? Can a grapevine produce figs? Of course not, and fresh water doesn't flow from a saltwater spring either.
- **13** Are any of you wise and understanding? Show that your actions are good with a humble lifestyle that comes from wisdom.

## **Bible Study on James**

#### Who is James?

James was probably the oldest of Christ's several brothers and sisters since he heads the list in Matthew 13:55. At first he did not believe in Jesus and even challenged him and misunderstood his mission (John 7: 2-5). Later James became a committed disciple and a leader in Jerusalem.

- 1. James was one of the select individuals Christ appeared to after his resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:7)
- 2. Paul called him a "pillar" of the church (Galatians 2:9)
- 3. Paul, on his first post-conversion visit to Jerusalem, saw James (Galatians 1:19)
- 4. Paul did the same on his last visit (Acts 21:18)
- 5. When Peter was rescued from prison, he told his friends to tall James (Acts 12:17)
- 6. James was a leader in the important council of Jerusalem (Acts 15:13)
- 7. Jude could identify himself simply as a "brother of James" (Jude 1:1), so well-known was James.

- 2. Jesus and the apostles Peter and Paul, were not always very "tame" when it came to the tongue. When is harsh language acceptable? Or is it?
- 3. How do verse 2 and verse 10 make you feel about your tongue? How will they prompt you to pray?
